Important Auction Information

There are *four* parts to the FROLIC 2016 Event: Live, Board, & Silent auctions and Dinner Drawings. The bidding format in each is different, but the results are the same—the highest bidder(s) wins! Please make sure you sign in and get your bidder number card before you start bidding on any items.

LIVE AUCTION

The live auction takes place in the sanctuary. After the auctioneer describes the item, bidding begins. To bid, simply raise your bidding number card so the auctioneer can see it. The winner is declared by the auctioneer.

BOARD AUCTIONS

Items auctioned on the board are group events such as dinners or outings that have a defined number of spots available. Board auction items have multiple winners. You can bid for one or all of the offerings. To win you must be one of the highest bidders. Winning bids will differ in amount.

SILENT AUCTIONS 1 and 2

Silent auction items are located in the Sanctuary. Write your name and bid amount on the Bidding Slip. Winning bid(s) are at the bottom of the list. There will be a “two-minute warning” before each table closes, so be alert for this announcement.

When the maximum number of bids is reached, as indicated by the “Number of Persons/Offerings”, bumping begins. If it is a single item, each bid bumps all previous bids. Use the extra page on the back cover of this catalog to keep track of the items on which you have bid. Check back often to be sure you have not been bumped.

BOARD AUCTION DINNER DRAWINGS

New this year we will have a drawing/raffle for chances at (2) two spots in the dinners offered. For \$20 you and a friend get a chance to join in one of the fabulous gourmet dinners. Drawing tickets for sale during the Board Action. Drawings will happen during the entertainment and live auction period. If there are 10 dinners offered, there will be 10 drawings for a winner!

Bumping

If you are out-bid, you have been “bumped.” You may enter a higher bid. Just enter your name and make a higher bid. For anything above \$20, please bump by at least \$5.00. If, for example, the item is a dinner for eight, the six highest bids will win. (Other two dinner spots are filled by a drawing.)

Closing

Each auction table will close at the time specified. No further bidding on these items will be allowed after closing. Keep track of your “winning bids” so you will know which items you purchased.

TAX INFORMATION

The following is common sense guidance. If \$10 is given to the fellowship in exchange for something worth \$10, only the donor of the item can deduct that \$10.

Keep records for your charitable donations and purchases. Any money you spend at FROLIC will not be included on your statement of donations to the fellowship. Keep your catalog, your copy of items purchased and your canceled check for next year’s tax time. As a donor you must keep your receipts and record of expenses.
