Important Auction Information

There are three parts to the FROLIC 2019 Event:

1)Live Auction, 2) Silent Auctions, 3) Bid Board Auctions including Dinner Drawings The bidding format in each is different, but the results are the same—the highest bidder(s) wins! Please check in at Bowman Hall to get your bidder number before you start bidding on any items.

LIVE AUCTION [Live]

The live auction takes place in the sanctuary. After the auctioneer describes the item, bidding begins. To bid, simply raise your bidding number so the auctioneer can see it. The winner is declared by the auctioneer.

SILENT AUCTIONS [S-1 and S-2]

Silent auction items are located in the Sanctuary. Write your name and bid amount on the Bidding Slip. Winning bid(s) are at the bottom of the list. There will be a "two-minute warning" before each table closes, so be alert for this announcement. Use the page inside the back cover of this catalog to keep track of the items on which you have bid. Check back often to be sure you have not been bumped.

BID BOARD AUCTIONS [B-1 and B-2]

Items auctioned on the board are group events such as dinners or outings that have a defined number of spots available. Board auction items have multiple winners. You can bid for one or all of the offerings. To win you must be one of the highest bidders. Winning bids will differ in amount.

BID BOARD AUCTION DRAWINGS

There will be a drawing for chances at (2) two spots in the dinners offered. For only \$20 you and a friend get a chance to join in one of the fabulous gourmet dinners. Bid Board Drawing tickets will be for sale during the Bid Board Auction. Tax Information


The following is common sense guidance. If \$10 is given to the fellowship in exchange for something worth \$10, only the donor of the item can deduct that \$10.

Keep records for your charitable donations and purchases. Any money you spend at FROLIC will not be included on your statement of donations to the fellowship. Keep your catalog, your copy of items purchased, and your canceled check for next year's tax time. As a donor, you must keep track of your expenses.

You cannot deduct, as a charitable contribution, any money you give to the church if you receive something of equal ("Fair Market Value" or FMV) or greater value in return. However, if you pay more than FMV, you may deduct any amount you pay over the fair market value. We urge you to consult a tax specialist if you plan on deducting any portion of your donation, either for items purchased or the amount you spend on hosting a party or for items which you donate.


